About Salem Academy

Our Community:

Salem, Oregon's capitol, is the third largest city in the state, with a population of approximately 200,000 in the Salem/Keizer area. Salem is situated in the center of the Willamette Valley—one of the most fertile and agriculturally productive regions in the nation—47 miles south of Portland and 64 miles north of Eugene. State government is the largest employer with approximately 13,000 employees.

Mission Statement:

The mission and vision of Salem Academy Christian Schools is to provide an excellent education, from a Christ-centered, Biblical perspective, so that our students might know and serve God.

History:

Founded in 1945, we have served this community for over 75 years. All programs are housed on a 30-acre campus on Lancaster Drive behind Academy Square across from the Willamette Town Center.

Accreditation and Memberships:

Salem Academy is fully accredited by Cognia (formerly AdvancEd) and the Association of Christian Schools International (ACSI), and meets all requirements for graduation of the Oregon State Department of Education. Salem Academy has also started the process for full accreditation with ASCI.

Organization:

Salem Academy is operated as a non-denominational, 501 (c) (3) non-profit corporation.

Enrollment:

From 60 students in 1945, Salem Academy enrolls a PreK-12 student body of 803 in 25-26.

Student Composition:

Male 50% Female 50%

Finances:

The 2024-25 operating budget is approximately \$7.9 million. Around 3.5% of the budget supplemented with outside income.

Religious Connection and Demographics:

Students attend over 80 different churches in the area and come from the following communities in (2) counties: Aumsville, Aurora, Brooks, Dallas, Independence, Keizer, Lyons, Marion, Monmouth, Silverton, Salem, Sublimity, Stayton, Turner, and Woodburn.

Admissions:

Admissions are selective. Students and families must agree on the Mission Statement and Articles of Faith. Students are evaluated on the basis of their transcripts, test scores, recommendations, and an interview. SA does not discriminate on the basis of race, nationality, gender, or ethnic origin.

Graduates:

Over 4,000 students have graduated from Salem Academy since 1946. Many of our graduates go into business, education, ministry, military, professional training, and foreign missions.

Scholarships:

Approximately 19% of K-12 students receive some type of financial aid.

What Grads do with a SA Education:

Based on 2025 graduates, 90% of students attend college, 4% trade education and 6% military, missions, or undecided. Students have been accepted to Baylor University, Columbia University, DigiPen Institute of Technology, George Washington University, Penn State University, Princeton Theological Seminary, University of California - Davis, University of Richmond, Virginia Tech University, Willamette University, as well as many other local and national colleges and universities.

Honors Courses Offered:

Bioethics, H. English I, H. English II, H. English III, H. English IV, Psychology, Chamber Choir, Jazz Band, Spanish III, Spanish IV, Spanish V, Pre-Calculus, Calculus I, Statistics and Probability, AP European History, AP US History, AP Government, H. Physical Science, H. Chemistry, H. Biology I, H. Physics, Genetics, Biology II, Functional Anatomy, and H. Introduction to Elementary Education.

Academic Achievements

Salem Academy sent the first all-female robotics team from Oregon to the 2018 VEX Worlds Champions after finishing 2nd in the State.

At the elementary level, Salem Academy regularly participates in S.A.L.T. (Salem Area Literature Tournament).

Our Science Department is one of the Willamette Valley's best. Classes include: Physical Science, Biology I and II, Physics, Human Anatomy, Genetics, and Chemistry. In these classes our science students have the opportunity to earn up to 15 college credits through dual credit.

International Student Programs:

Multi-culturalism is enhanced with the presence of foreign students ranging from the following: Korea, Japan, Taiwan, China, Vietnam, Indonesia, and Thailand.

Requirements:

Graduation requires the completion of a minimum of 24 credits plus an additional Bible credit for each year at SA. Each student must participate in at least 10 hours of community service per year of attendance at SA in order to graduate.

Athletic Achievements:

Approximately 80% of Salem Academy secondary students par-ticipate in athletics during the 2024-25 school year. SA has achieved 20 state championships, and over 86 district championships in a variety of sports, in addition to the Sportsmanship Award. SA is a member of Oregon School Activities Association (OSAA), 3A Division, PacWest league. Sports include: football, volleyball, basketball, baseball, softball, track & field, cross country, golf, soccer, and swim.

Articles of Faith
