

2025 AUCTION RECAP

The 2025 auction kicked off Salem Academy's incredible 80th anniversary, a celebration that will continue into the 2025-2026 school year. The children at SA, followed by the scholarship paddle auction brought together school families, alumni, and friends of SA to fundraise and celebrate the school's past and the many years to come. Event emcee and Secondary Principal Lindsy Brownell started the program in prayer, followed by a Capital Campaign update by Superintendent Tim Peterson. SA parent and teacher Lindsay Walker

spoke of how God has worked in her family's life during tragedy and His blessing to keep her raise. Auctioneer Paul Schultz led guests in an exciting evening of live bidding, with a break for the dessert dash--a crowd favorite. Thanks to our sponsors, donors, committee members, and guests for this fun and blessed event. Your generous support helped us raise nearly \$160,000 for the school!

CAPITAL CAMPAIGN

"I tell you, in the same way, there will be more joy in heaven over one sinner who repents than over ninety-nine righteous people who have no need of repentance."

This past school year has brought countless blessings from God. We saw His provisions poured on Salem Academy during Spiritual Emphasis Week, when we witnessed students accepting Christ, being baptized, and heard impactful messages from student peers. God has changed many hearts of the kids who come through our doors, and we have a special opportunity to foster even more students' growth in their faith and relationship with Christ through SA's capital campaign. This campaign will equip us to have a larger impact on the community by welcoming an additional 119 secondary students. Salem Academy's capital campaign will also enable us to lead the development of Christ-centered 21st Century skills by providing innovative technology and educational space that equips

students with the knowledge, skills, and faith built on a personal relationship with God. Tech-ready classrooms will elevate programming, including computeraided design, robotics, life sciences, and physical sciences.

With a goal of \$14.6M, and after receiving generous donations from SA families, friends, and in-kind donations from local businesses, the campaign is in need of a little more than \$5M. Rich Duncan Construction has been selected as the contractor and permits should be secured by winter 2025, with a construction completion goal of fall 2027. Praise God for His provisions through our generous donors!

SOFTBALL

Softball had an outstanding season! Our Crusaders are 18-0 in the league, securing their second consecutive undefeated league title. Our Crusaders made it to the Semifinals at the OSAA Playoffs, where their season ended. Overall, sitting at 23-5, the team is ranked 5th in the state for their division!





BASEBALL

The baseball program has made great strides this year. A wave of new players brought fresh energy to the team, and although the varsity roster is young, they've demonstrated tremendous growth. The addition of a JV team has also been a valuable development tool. Varsity is currently in 4th place in the Special District with an overall record of 8-17. The outlook for the future of the program is very promising.





TRACK & FIELD


Both the boys and girls track teams are on a historic path. Both squads won their district championships and brought home dual trophies for the first time in 30 years. Two school records have already been broken on the girls side (including one dating back to the 1980s), with more expected to fall. This senior class is leaving a lasting legacy on the program.





GOLF

The golf program is thriving with 16 boys and 8 girls participating this season. The girls team won the team title at state with a score of 654,30 strokes ahead of second-place. They've been competing with just four players—three sophomores and one junior—and they have been invited to the PGA National High School Golf Association, in North Carolina! On the boys side, interest continues to grow, though most players are still developing competitive experience. The team represented Salem Academy well at their district meet on May 12–13, finishing out a solid season.
